CHILD SAFETY SEAT FIT GUIDE

This guide is designed to help you select and properly install a child safety seat compatible with your 2009 Infiniti G Convertible. To compile this list, our safety engineers fitted numerous Child Restraint Systems (CRS), including infant restraints, forward-facing child seats, booster seats and their combinations.

If properly installed, the CRS noted below have proven to fit securely in the rear seating locations using either the LATCH (Lower Anchors and Tethers for Children) System, where available, or the vehicle's seat belt. Note that the rear seating locations are not equipped with top tether anchorages. Do not install forward-facing child seats that utilize a top tether in this vehicle. Only rear-facing child seats and booster seats noted below have been determined to fit properly. Always refer to the instructions provided with the CRS and your vehicle's Owner's Manual when installing. You may also find the accompanying General Installation Tips helpful.
